



Creating a New GBS

Key steps to establish a new GBS capability from scratch:

1. Build the business case

- Analyze current state costs, pain points and benchmark against peers
- Identify candidate services and target operating model
- Estimate potential savings and service improvements
- Define success metrics and timeline
- Socialize recommendation and secure leadership mandate

2. Set up the GBS organization and plan

- Define service scope aligned to business priorities
- Design organization structure, roles and responsibilities
- Develop policies and operating procedures
- Create transition plan crossing people, process and technology

3. Stand up shared service centers

- Determine locations balancing costs, language, talent and time zones
- Set up infrastructure - physical, technology, security
- Hire and train teams on processes and systems
- Manage service provider relationships if outsourcing

4. Transition operations and launch

- Pilot processes and system integration
- Migrate data, contracts and assets
- Handle change management for business users
- Establish SLAs and continuous improvement programs

5. Optimize and expand over time

- Refine policies, processes, KPIs based on data
- Expand scope to new services
- Evolve operating model to next stage

In summary, establishing GBS requires meticulous upfront planning followed by phased rollout and continuous improvement powered by data and user feedback.
